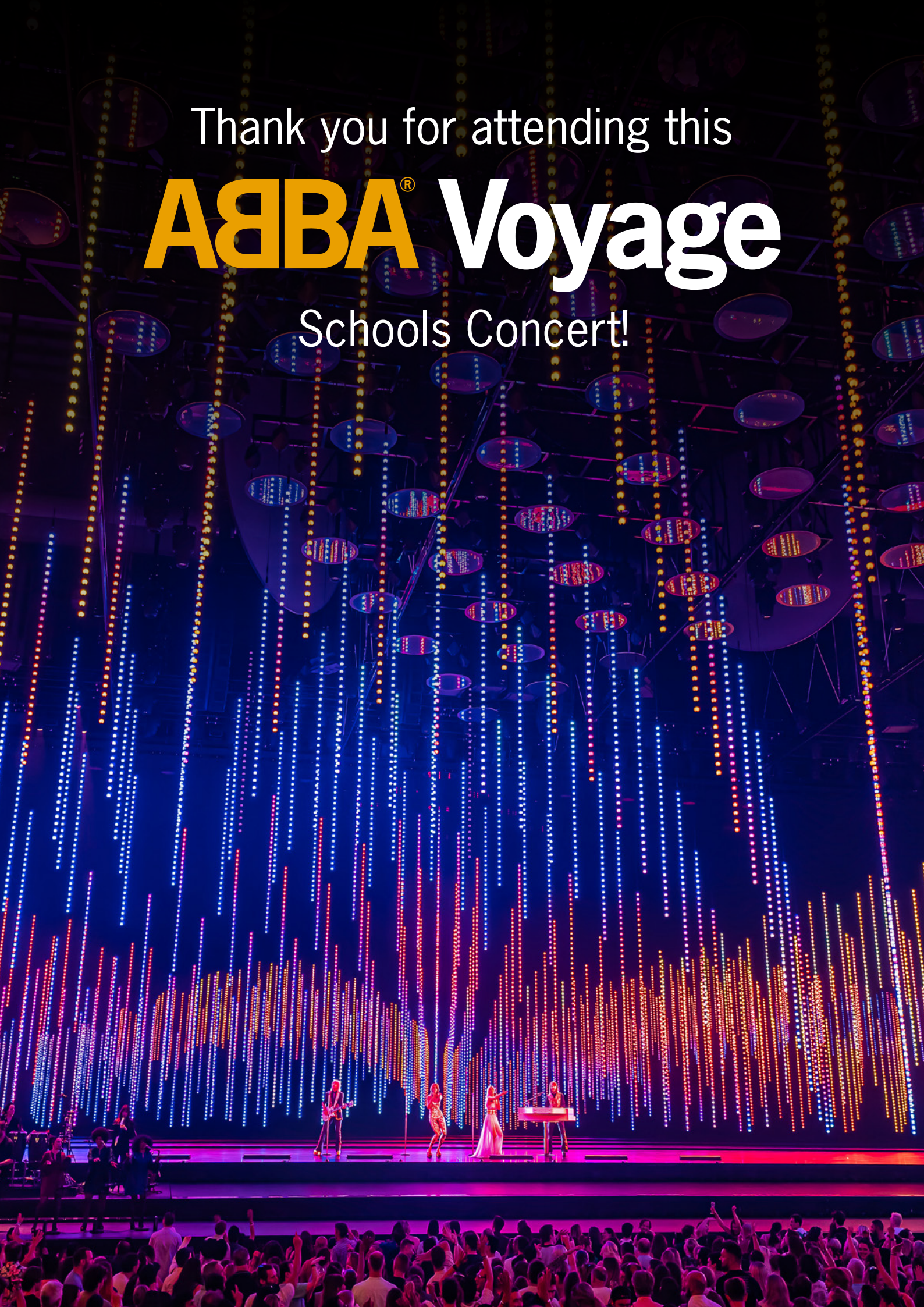

## Newham

### Creative Newham

An independent alliance of arts, cultural, educational, social and voluntary organisations championing creativity in Newham. They are building a bold, collaborative network of creatives, educators, cultural leaders, and community organisations who believe in the power of culture to transform lives.



### Creative Newham: Cultural Producers Programme

A six month (part-time) in-depth training opportunity to help you enter the arts, heritage, health or environment sectors as a producer ready to put on a range of creative events or programming in the local community. The programme is free and open to Newham residents aged 18–30 who have some experience working or volunteering in any cultural or arts-related organisation or project, and who have the passion and drive to pursue a career in this field.



### Rosetta Arts

Rosetta Arts empowers the lives of East Londoners through inclusive visual arts programmes that nurture creativity, wellbeing and creative careers. They deliver exciting, innovative and creative courses, workshops and experiences.



### Theatre Royal, Stratford East

Stratford East We have a range of activities available to all. From youth theatres to community partnerships, schools programmes to development opportunities for young people and adults.



### Stratford East Young Technicians

This FREE introductory training programme offers 18–25-year-olds the opportunity to develop practical skills in lighting, sound and stagecraft with industry professionals. This course aims to address the imbalance and under-representation of backstage professionals from the Global Majority; lower socioeconomic backgrounds; those who are care experienced; those who identify as female, non-binary, transgender; those who are deaf or disabled; and those from areas of low arts engagement.



## Newham

### Newham Music Academy

Newham Music is the award-winning music hub for Newham. We are committed to providing high-quality music education and opportunities to children and young people. Newham Music Academy is our after school and Saturday music centre with music lessons, ensembles and choirs happening Monday-Thursday evenings during the week. On Saturday mornings the place comes alive with hundreds of children and young people learning, playing and developing their musicianship



### Links Studios

A state-of-the-art recording studio which has been purpose-built for teaching and developing young people through music. (A division of Catch22, that designs and delivers services that build resilience and aspiration in people of all ages and within communities across the UK.) 10-25 year-olds can learn how to produce and record digital music, take part in rehearsals to enhance their live performance skills, and learn about creating and recording podcasts. Our focused programmes range from music production to podcasting workshops and can be accessed after school from 3pm to 7pm.

### Hackney Music Service

We also offer a special programme of out-of-school instrumental tuition across a 10 week term. We also occasionally of FREE 3 day courses, most recently a music production and composing course for film and media.

### Arcola Theatre

Arcola Theatre have been pioneers in targeted community theatre since our inception in 2000. At present, we run:



**Arcola Youth Theatre:** Aged 9–16 from Hackney. Enhancing performance skills, and fostering creativity through various aspects of theatre-making, including set design, lighting, sound, scriptwriting, and directing.

**Arcola Academy:** an opportunity for young Hackney creatives aged 18–25 to develop, expand, and explore theatre and performance as a professional pathway.

**Arcola Community Companies:** provide free and low cost opportunities to marginalised groups to explore theatre practices as an ensemble, expand networks and build communities and be involved in high quality performance based projects.

### 10x10

The Hackney 10x10 Programme is a new initiative to support every child in Hackney to achieve 10 amazing activities by the time they are 10 years old. Two included activities are taking part in drama and performing arts and having a musical experience.

## Thames Music

Our service is dedicated to providing music education and opportunities for young people. We offer a range of music programs, lessons and activities for students in the Tower Hamlets borough and beyond.



- **Children's choir** – For 7–11 years olds who live or attend school in Tower Hamlets. Its FREE.
- **Wednesday Music Centre (WMC)** for primary school students in the early stages of instrumental learning. first term is FREE for every student. There is a termly fee of £53 after that (from Sep 2026).
- **Saturday Music Centre (SMC)** is for young people (7–18) who play an instrument and have been learning for at least a year. The first term is FREE for new students (not including those who have transferred up from WMC). There is a termly fee of £110.
- **Soundbox** – Soundbox is an all-ability inclusive music collective that brings together disabled and non-disabled musicians aged 11–25 to make and create music using a mix of traditional instruments, music technology and singing.

As a leading UK provider of industry-led apprenticeships, BCE helps businesses attract fresh talent and upskill their existing teams. Based in Walthamstow, our tailored programmes develop emerging talent and equip your workforce with the skills needed for long-term success.



We offer apprenticeships across our Stage, Electrics, Front of House, and Box Office departments. For Stage and Electrics apprentices, the hands-on learning will be invaluable and will allow students to learn practical skills while also obtaining vital qualifications through coursework and exams. For those working in our Front of House and Box Office environments, they will learn how to assist customers and get to grips with key operational processes. The apprenticeship programme takes 12 months to complete, and requires time to be spent on both practical work in the Theatre and coursework.



With years of expertise in apprenticeships, Access Industry provide a diverse range of programmes across various fields, including Digital, Events, Software Development, Sport, and Business. The Level 3 Live Event Technician apprenticeship teaches students to handle the dynamic world of live event production, blending technical skills with hands-on experience from day one.



ATG offer a two-year apprenticeship which includes learning lighting, flies and stage. Providing the opportunity to work in at least two of their theatres and at the end of course apprentices have the skills and experience require to work as a multi-skilled technician. ATG require applicants to have a level 2 qualification (equivalent to GCSE) in English, Maths, and ICT. ATG offer the creative venue technician apprenticeship at Level 3 (equivalent to A level). The apprenticeship is 80% practical and 20% work focused.

## LW THEATRES

The LW Theatres apprenticeship, run in partnership with Access Creative College, works towards a Level 3 Creative Venue Technician Apprenticeship while gaining valuable experience on some of the biggest shows in the world! You'll rotate through different areas of our Technical Departments – like stage flying systems, props, scenery, lighting, sound, and automation – before specialising in the area you love most.



## National Theatre

Paid work with a minimum 12-month placement for a full-time contract. Targeting individuals studying at GCSEs or A Level. The National Theatre offer backstage apprenticeships in a range of roles over the years they have had a prop making apprentice, scenic metal fabricator apprentice, scenic carpenter apprentice, scenic artist apprentice and a creative venue technician apprentice (lighting, sound and stage crew). They also offer apprenticeships in business operations in positions such as an IT support engineer, Facilities, Marketing Data Analyst and Events.



The Royal Shakespeare Company provide paid apprenticeships in Operations, Automation, Learning, Front of house, Carpentry, and engineering. Apprenticeships at the Royal Shakespeare Company are targeted at individuals wanting a work-based path into backstage theatre, with the opportunity to gain a level 2 qualification (GCSE grade A\*-C/9-4) and/or a level 3 qualification (equivalent to an A level.) Apprentices spend 80% of their time at the RSC and 20% with their training provider.



Apprenticeships at the Royal Opera House are available to individuals aged 18 or over who don't have a degree or equivalent qualification. Apprenticeships are offered in Costume and wardrobe, Scenic construction and scenic art, Marketing, Learning and Participation and Technical theatre. All apprentices are paid the National Living Wage, rising by 2.5% in the second year and will work between 40 to 42.5 hours a week spending one day per week at college achieving a level 3 qualification (equivalent to A level).

### WORK EXPERIENCE / PROGRAMMES



A small but mighty National Portfolio Organisation dedicated to increasing career opportunities for underrepresented Young Adults who want a career within the music and creative industries.

#### **The Young Shoots Programme**

A bespoke 6-month training and development programme built around the needs of the YOU and the demands of the fast-moving music and creative industries.

#### **The Short Sharp Shot Programme**

A bespoke intensive 8-week training programme for Young People aged 18-24 who would like to work in the music or the creative industry.



A work experience placement at British Youth Music Theatre involves working alongside professional artistic and technical staff on a residential production with a company of between 35-40 young people from across the UK. Each candidate will be partnered with an industry professional aligned with their role who will act as their professional line manager and mentor, and a pastoral staff member who will oversee their personal wellbeing whilst on production. The placements are ideally suited to conservatoire and university graduates or final year students wishing to develop a career within the theatre industry and are interested in working with young people. The positions offered in work experience are generally but not limited to Assistant Stage Manager, Assistant Music Director and Assistant Designers.

### **GUILDHALL SCHOOL**

Get Backstage introduces young people to Guildhall Production Arts programmes, offering hands-on workshops to try some of the skills and techniques taught to students, and providing information about the many career pathways available to graduates. Participants will join half day workshops, in-person at Guildhall School, linked to the five Production Arts programmes that we offer: Costume, Design Realisation, Digital Design and Production, Stage Management and Theatre Technology. Participants must Be in year 11 or 12 (or equivalent year of college).



Half Moon is committed to providing quality work experience opportunities to young people who live or go to school in Tower Hamlets who are keen to find out more about different job roles.

Work Experience is open to Secondary School/College Students and Higher Education Students.



ATG Careers offer Work Experience for students in Year 10 or above.

### WORK EXPERIENCE / PROGRAMMES

#### LW THEATRES

Spend a week with us during the school summer holidays, getting hands-on experience in one of three work experience programmes: Technical Theatre, Theatre Operations, or Marketing.



#### THE OLD VIC

**Front Line** gives 16–30-year-olds the opportunity to discover more about careers in theatre and develop key transferable skills through paid placements with our Front of House team. Participants will watch one of the productions, shadow various members of staff and take on important roles welcoming patrons to the theatre.



**OV Backstage** offers paid placements on an Old Vic production to six 18–25-year-olds from underrepresented backgrounds in the arts. Participants shadow an industry professional across 15 paid sessions and get hands-on experience in one of the following disciplines: Costume, Production Management, Set, Sound and Stage Management. The project culminates with a networking session to help participants take the next steps in their careers.

**OV Facilitators** is a highly successful creative practitioner programme for people aged 18+, offering advanced hands-on experience in creative facilitation and the chance to develop key transferable skills.

#### Young Vic

Throughout the year we have many different opportunities for people in our local area to sign up to take part in workshops, discussions, events and productions for young people (6- to 25) who live, work, study in Lambeth and Southwark, or have no fixed address.



You don't need to have any previous theatre experience to get involved. All our activities are FREE to engage with, including Tickets to see all Young Vic productions, Workshops, Masterclasses and Targeted Projects

We deliver innovative new projects and workshops each year that welcome young people into our building to inspire and develop their practice as theatre-makers.

**The Jerwood Assistant Director** is a paid opportunity to assist on a Young Vic show. Learning from experienced artists by assisting is a vital chance to develop skills and understanding. Equally, having the chance to spend time in a theatre and understand how the various departments work together is also an important aspect of an artist's knowledge.



The programme will include: An assistantship on a Young Vic production or co-production A two-week tailored placement observing day to day running of the theatre, attending planning and management meetings and spending time in departments such as marketing, production, and development.

# BURSARIES/ FINANCIAL SUPPORT

**Worried about the cost? Most drama schools offer bursaries, scholarships, and financial help – check their websites to see what you could apply for.**

## **Study Essentials Grant**

The Study Essentials Grant is here to support students from East London who are studying for a degree at universities in and around the Queen Elizabeth Olympic Park. The grant specifically supports the purchase of essential equipment, materials, or activities required to successfully complete your studies.



## **Equity Bursary Scheme**

We are the performing arts and entertainment trade union. Members benefit from feeling confident knowing you're always protected at work - or while looking for work - with insurance, legal advice, representation, guidance, support and counselling, plus a range of financial benefits. From our specialist tax and welfare advice and Social Security and Tax Helplines, to access to grants from the Equity Benevolent Fund if you're facing financial hardship. You can also join the Equity Pension Scheme to save for your future.



## **Roundhouse Financial Support**

The Roundhouse have designed a credit scheme to help individuals that may be experiencing any barriers that may prevent them from attending projects or events that could be helped by financial support – including help with project costs, transport, and childcare. The scheme is designed to support you in taking the next step in developing your creative skills. Credit can be used for all sorts of things, such as: Roundhouse youth programme workshops, events and courses, Materials required for a Roundhouse youth programme, Creative Studio Membership (CSM), Hiring studio facilities once you have a Creative Studio Membership, Transport expenses within London (for travel to and from the Roundhouse only), Childcare and 1:1 support worker, carer or interpreter.
